Narrative:

A thorough search was conducted, pursuant to a warrant, looking for items stolen during the above burglary. Officers present for the search were Officers Clack, Taylor, Pepper, and Dumas. While executing the warrant on the premises of Connie and Casey Cutter, 5446 N. Lombard, the undersigned officer conducted the search and the consequent seizure of two items, (one stuffed animal - a dog with a JAMBLAS t-shirt and ID tag showing it is #1 of 2000, allegedly stolen during a burglary on June 23 or 24, 2009, from the premises of one Pat Siewert at 5400 N. Lombard, Marshall City, and one marking pen Chartpack marker, crimson, P 82 (43), which the officer recognized from a lab report recently received describing the ink found on the wall of the Lake Kennedy Federation after a break-in on those premises on the same night, the 23rd or 24th of June, 2009. Officer had probable cause to believe that this is the same pen as used to write on the wall of the Federation's premises at 53 W. Johnson Blvd, room 302, as preliminary lab report shows that the ink type is the same. At the time of the search, the owner of the premises was not arrested or confined in any way, and make the following statements to the arresting officers:

When the undersigned officer located and seized the stolen collectible stuffed animal (dog with JAMBLAS t-shirt and ID tag "1 of 2000"), the owner of the premises said, "I don't know how that got there" and "that is not mine. I did not put that there. Someone else must have put that there." When the undersigned officer asked, "Who put it there if you did not?" Connie Cotter said it could have been one "Donnie Thompson" or one "Leslie Foote." Connie Cotter also saw the undersigned seizing the pen, and said, "You can have it if you want it."

One unique JAMBLAS Teddy Bear Dog, identified as 1 of 2000, No. N56767678

A crimson marker, No. N56767679
